

REALIZING DREAMS

In early 2021, our Supportive Housing team met a gentleman named Roy. For the past five years, Roy had built an intricate encampment complete with a generator and chicken coop to sustain himself and his chickens. When presented with the idea of moving, Roy was clear...if he couldn't keep his beloved chickens, he would remain outdoors and officially homeless. Considering this, the team contacted our friends at the Waterford Country School and the chickens were graciously welcomed to stay temporarily at their farm while a home was located for Roy and his roost. With the chickens comfortably relocated, Roy's search for a new home began. A rural apartment was located, and a friendship was struck between Roy and his new landlord. Throughout the summer and fall, a group of volunteers built a elaborate coop at Roy's new home and he and his chickens were reunited.

Roy is enjoying his new home and has welcomed new chicks to the flock. Roy's love for his feathered family compelled our community to unite and create the perfect home for him and his chickens. We are grateful for all who made this dream a reality.





Since last year, our Wellness Center has evolved into a highly sought-after space for use for groups, meetings, and community activities. With a 9,000-square-foot area to work with, spread across four distinct spaces, we can now be flexible to accommodate multiple events simultaneously, accomplishing our original goal.

This year marked the first collaboration with United Way of Eastern Connecticut, Tommy Toy Fund, and Norwich Police Department to provide a much-needed large, accessible space for their yearly toy giveaway event. The Wellness Center quickly transformed into a Winter Wonderland as volunteers handed out toys to over 750 children over three days. We also laid the carpet in both meeting rooms which helped to dampen sound and create a warmer environment. A big thank you go to the Lord Family Foundation, our contractors, and custodial staff for helping to make this dream a reality.

Over the next year, we aim to develop a workout area, a book nook, a leisure hang-out area, and much more!




