The Reliance Health Outpatient Clinic swiftly embraced audio and video Telehealth services, accelerating our existing plan to integrate a more accessible support option. Despite the obstacles, the momentum we have gained in 2020 will help to strengthen our approach as we enter the next phase of the pandemic and plan for whatever tomorrow holds.

1,205 individuals from 46 towns in Connecticut were served through 42 Reliance Health Programs.

Individual and group therapy was accessed by **381** people.

482 individuals utilized the Reliance **Health Outpatient** Services medication management program.

Over 100 individuals were connected with community-based recovery groups including AA, NA, ACOA, AL-ANON, & SMART.

Early Screening assisted 333 low-risk offenders in connecting with services and supports, diverting them from entering the criminal justice system.

**25** people served through Supported Education completed CNA courses, certifications in Accounting & Customer Service, and CDA credentialing. 6 individuals were assisted with GED goals.

182 individuals connected with Career Services for assistance with obtaining competitive employment.

Employer Spotlight: Lake of Isles
has provided many job opportunities for those served
by Career Services and our Outreach to Homeless program. They have also been instrumental in collaborating with Reliance Health staff to ensure the success of those they employ.

The Supported **Education Program** assisted 7 college students in transitioning to fully online learning when in-person classes

167 individuals connected with the Outreach to Homeless program for support in finding permanent housing.

51 men & women were provided temporary housing through the Reliance Health shelters.

#### Reliance Health is a progressive agency at the forefront of

**person-centered services.** We provide over 40 programs to support the mental health needs of the community. These programs include but are not limited to service coordination, peer support, supportive housing, employment services, supported education, social rehabilitation, shelter and homeless outreach, respite, young adult services, social and recovery-focused clubhouses, individualized support programming, individual and group therapy, medication services, recovery coaching, and supported living. We aim to meet the challenges of providing access to a more complete, coordinated, and effective system of community-based behavioral health services and support.



We provide 24/7 care in 12 homes and 2 apartment buildings located throughout Eastern Connecticut. During Fiscal Year 2020, 129 individuals received services from these homes through an array of supports including harm reduction, veterans support, life skills, and transitional living.







## **Food Bags**

In Fiscal Year 2020 the Reliance Health Food Pantry saw a 58% increase in those accessing the resource. With help from United Way's Gemma Moran Food Center and neighbors, such as The Royal Punjabi, we were able to meet the demand. Each week program staff came together to pick up food, prepare 60-70 food bags, and deliver them to those in need. This was no small task and demonstrated how well our teams work together to serve those in need.





#### **Telehealth**

Reliance Health was able to upgrade the agency's telehealth and virtual meeting subscriptions as well as purchase much-needed hardware to expand our clinical and group activity access with the help of \$18,601 in funds received from the Federal Communications Commission COVID-19 Telehealth Program.

## **Legislative Advocacy**

Chief Operating Officer, Mike Van Vlaenderen, and Program Director, Mike Doyle met with Congressman Joe Courtney in Washington D.C. during the National Council for Behavior Health's Hill Day. Later in the year, Chief Executive Officer Carrie Dyer testified in front of the Appropriations Committee in favor of increasing funding for Community Nonprofits. Staff and program participants at Reliance Health are committed to legislative advocacy to bring awareness to the importance of community-based mental health services while striving to overcome funding deficits.

## The Norwich Recovery

Coach Program (formerly known as the Coordinated Addiction Recovery System, or CARS) is funded by the Department of Mental Health and Addiction Services "How Can We Help" grant and partners with Norwich Human Services and the Norwich Heroin Task Force to connect with individuals seeking support to overcome opioid use. The Norwich Police Department assists the team with checking-in on individuals who have recently experienced an overdose. Recovery Coaches provide leave-behind bags for those they visit, complete with NARCAN, resources for support, and other supportive items, such as heart-shaped stress balls stamped with Reliance Health's phone number, provided by funding from 4lmprint's "One by One" grant. The Recovery Coach program also provides NARCAN kits and training to community members, families, and area businesses while making themselves available to share resources and support. Additionally, Recovery Coaches provide short and long-term case management to the individuals they serve, further demonstrating their commitment to helping those struggling with opioids.




# FRIDAY DOWNTOWN NORWICH


